



**Directions to the Area:**

From Primghar, take B40 west one mile to Roosevelt Avenue. Travel south 3 1/2 miles.

From Paullina, take L48 north four miles to B46. Travel east two miles to Roosevelt Avenue and south 1/2 mile.

The parking area will be located on the east side of Roosevelt Avenue.

**Procedure:**

Registration permits will be located at the kiosk in the parking lot. Fill out the permit and display on the dash of your vehicle. Clearly mark the permit area in which your group will be hunting.

**Boundaries:**

The boundary of the hunting area will be designated with signage such as this.

**POST PERMIT ON DASH SO IT CAN BE CLEARLY SEEN

## Rules & Regulations:

1. Special use permits must be clearly displayed on the dash of the vehicle so that it can be clearly seen from the outside.
2. Each hunting party must include the same number of adults as youth. Youth must be 15 years old or under and adults must be at least 21 years old. Adults must be unarmed.
3. There is a limit of one hunting party per area on a first come-first serve basis. Hunters must check the permits displayed to determine the open location.
4. The two permit times each day are from 1 hour before opening time through noon and from noon to 1 hour after closing time.
5. Park vehicles only in the designated area.
6. Honor all boundaries.
7. There is no game cleaning on site.
8. The Conservation Board and all other law enforcement personnel have the right to revoke hunting privileges for due cause.
9. All State of Iowa Game Laws apply.
10. Use non-toxic shot only except for turkey and deer hunting.

## Safety Tips:

- Treat every gun as if it were loaded.
- Always point gun in a safe direction.
- Be sure of your target.
- Carry your gun in a safe manner.
- Make sure your gun is in good working order.
- Respect private property.
- No hunting within 200 yards of buildings.

## Purpose of Area:
